

COLLEGE PROFILE

ABOUT DEITHOR

Located in the foothills of scenic Deo Pahar, the uneven landscape on the banks of Deithor River is known as Deithor. Adjacent to Karbi Pahar, situated amongst the mesmerising Tea Gardens near Numaligarh, this area of Deithor falls under the Bokajan Legislative Assembly. Located beside the Golaghat district, Deithor falls under the Chilonijan Revenue Circle and is only 500 meters away from the 39th National Highway. Recently declared as a town, there are several opinions regarding the origin of the name 'Deithor'. According to one popular belief, the name 'Deithor' came from the proximity of the town to Deo Pahar. Another popular belief suggests that there are 'Deo'— ghosts in the river Deithor flowing through this region. This belief led people to call this area Deithor.

ABOUT OF THE COLLEGE

With an aim to achieve expansion in higher education with inclusion, equity and quality, and to enhance the access to degree courses in Educationally Backward Districts (EBDs), the Government of India decided to set up Model Degree Colleges in the EBDs. Although initially these institutes are developed as institutes for Higher Secondary and Undergraduate level teaching, the government also has a plan to introduce Post Graduate (PG) level / Skill development courses in these institutes in future as per the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020). With this plan in mind, Government Model College, Deithor, Karbi Anglong has been established by the Higher Education Department, Government of Assam with an intention of spreading higher education in the remote and comparatively underdeveloped area of Karbi Anglong. In 2013, the Karbi-Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC) allotted 35 bighas of land to the Government Model College, Deithor, under the Chilonijan Revenue Circle. The funding for the college has been provided jointly by the Government of Assam and Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA). Dr. Dipok Kumar Bora joined as the Principal of the College on 15th September 2020. Under his leadership, the institute grows, and he acts as coordinator for activities concerning the College. The College is affiliated with Dibrugarh University, Dibrugarh vide Government notification AHE. 570/2016/53 dated 15.10.2020. Following Dr. Bora's appointment, 17 (seventeen) Assistant Professors in six departments, i.e., English, Assamese, Economics, Education, Sociology and Political Science, along with a Librarian, have been appointed by the Directorate of Higher Education (DHE), Government of Assam as per latest UGC norms/qualifications. The then Honourable Minister of Education, Assam, Dr. Himanta Bishwa Sharma, handed over the appointment letters to the newly appointed faculty on 19th December, 2020. A total of 63 students have enrolled in various programmes. The college has started regular classes from 28 December, 2020

FACILITIES AND STUDENT SUPPORT

BONG LONG TERANG LIBRARY AND INFORMATION CENTRE, GMCD

The library of Government Model College, Deithor, is named 'Bonglong Terang Library and Information Centre' after a renowned literary figure, Ru Bonglong Terang. The library presently has more than 1500 books on different subjects. i.e., English, Assamese, Karbi, Sociology, Economics, Political Science, Education, History, etc. The library has a rich reference section for the students and faculty of the college. The library has a back volume collection of the well-known Assamese magazine, 'Prantik', which contains its issues of the last 25 years. The library regularly procures two newspapers and two magazines for the users. Intending to serve the readers' community, the library has been planning to be a fully automated one. Numaligarh Refinery Limited has funded the library to digitize it and to develop a digital study lab. On completion of the project, students will be able to access physical as well as electronic resources for consultation. Along with the open eresources, some e-journals and databases will be subscribed by the library to support the teaching-learning process and research. Career Consultation Services, Reference Services, SDI, CAS, Book Bank Services for special (economically backward, meritorious, specially-abled) students, Book Club, OPAC, Reprographic Service, Remote Access to library collection, etc., are some other services to be provided by the library.

GIRLS HOSTEL

A Girls' Hostel with the capacity to accommodate approximately 60+ boarders is currently under construction on the campus of Government Model College, Deithor. This hostel will play a vital role in ensuring that students from remote areas will also get an opportunity to join the college and get access to quality education. Karbi Anglong, being a district dominated by hilly terrain and a large number of remote areas, has this hostel becomes a significant aspect.

SMART CLASSROOM

The college has smart classroom facility with necessary audio-visual equipmentBesides that the college also has well-equiped seminar hall and conference room which can be utilised for special interaction with students.

CC TV SURVEILLANCE

The College building is monitored under 24*7 CCTV surveillance to keep a track of the students' activities and monitor and prevent any objectionable occurrences.

SPORTS

Emphasising the importance of sports and games in today's world and concerning the individual's personality, health and fitness; the college lays considerable emphasis on students' participation in various games, sports and track & field activities. Various games and the sports facilities are available in the college, such as Badminton Court, Carrom, Football, Volleyball etc. Students are trained and encouraged to take part in different sports competitions. As part of such initiatives, the college has recently put together a Men's Football team which will in future, take part in at university, district and state level competition. Further, the students of the college have already participated in various sports events such as Dibrugarh University Youth Festival, Khel Maharan etc.

HEALTH CARE FACILITIES

The college has necessary first aid facilities. Besides that the Deithor Mini Primary Health Centre (MPHC) and the Vivekanandra Kendra NRL (VKNRL) Hospital are located close by to the college.



MENTORING SYSTEM

The college has implemented a robust student mentoring system through faculty mentors. Under this mentor-mentee system, a faculty mentor is assigned to a small group of students. This group meets the assigned mentor on weekly basis. The mentor attempts to develop a close personal bond with his/her mentees and the mentees are encouraged to share their problems in a free and friendly environment. The mentor-mentee system aims to mentor students in various areas, such as academic progress, career, psychological health, personality development etc.

TRAINING, PLACEMENT AND INTERNSHIP CELL

The training, placement, and internship cell of the college has been established to provide the students of the college with necessary training, guidance, and opportunities to improve their employability by developing the necessary skills and to grab suitable career options. The cell also looks after the internship aspects and provides necessary information to students for engaging in internships of their interest. Under the revised guidelines for the Four-Year UG Program issued by Dibrugarh University, internship has been made a mandatory component. Considering this, the training, placement, and internship cell has become more relevant for the students than ever.

STUDENT'S UNION

There is a students' union elected by the students themselves. Student unions as meeting spaces help students identify more with their peers and their school, building a strong foundation for networking in the future. The students' union organised a programme and helped the student community to promote their talent, culture, and spots in different places.

STUDENTS GRIEVANCE AND REDRESSAL COMMITTEE (SGRC)

As per UGC (Redressals of Grievances of Students) regulations of 2023, the college has established Students Grievance and Redressal Committee (SGRC). The committee comprises of the Principal, faculty members and student representatives is responsible for addressing and resolving any grivances raised by students at the college.

STUDENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

The Student Affairs Committee of the college strives toward creating a productive and nurturing environment for the students to acquire knowledge, engage in co-curricular activities, and work towards their overall growth. The committee is responsible for any and all affairs concerning students of the college. The committee that operates in close connection with the student union of the college holds a very special close bond with the student community.

FOUR-YEAR UNDER GRADUATE (UG) PROGRAMME (FYUGP)

Dibrugarh University Academic Council (Emergent) has approved university regulations for a Four-Year Undergraduate (UG) Programme in the Choice Based Credit System. Government Model College, Deithor has introduced this new Programme in the last Academic year.

1. UG Certificate programme

UG Certificate Programme leads to a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG certificate (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 40 Credits on completion of Semester II if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2nd semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

ii. UG Diploma Programme

UG Diploma Programme leads to a UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG Diploma (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 80 Credits on completion of Semester IV if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4th semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the maximum period of seven years.

iii. Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA) with single/double major:

Students who wish to undergo a 3-year (6 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing a minimum of 120 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

iv. Four Year UG Programme with honours (BA) with single/double major

Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years, securing a minimum of 160 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

v. Four Year UG Programme with honours with Research (BA) with single/double major:

Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours and research degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years with a rigorous research project, securing a minimum of 160 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

Students will also have the option to adopt the Single major with minor to complete their three year or Four-Year Degree Programme or Double major to complete their three year or Four-Year Degree Programme. Double major option will be provided as per the discretion and provisions of Dibrugarh University.

Minimum eligibility criteria for Multiple Entry points of the UG programmes

a. 1st year: Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary (Class 12) Certificate obtained after successful completion of Grade 12 or equivalent stage of education and/or Admission test conducted by College/University/National Level Testing Agency/State Level Testing Agency.

b. 2nd year: A certificate obtained after successful completion of 1-year (2 semesters) of the undergraduate programme or after successful completion of Diploma from Polytechnics after Class X. These students are to take admission in the 2nd year within a period of three years from obtaining the UG certificate from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution or Diploma certificate from Polytechnics recognized by Dibrugarh University.

c. 3rd year: A diploma obtained after successful completion of 2-years (4 semesters) of the undergraduate programme. These students are to take admission in the 3rd year UG programme within a period of three years from obtaining the UG diploma from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University.

d. 4th Year (Honours): A Bachelor's degree after successful completion of 3-years (6 semesters) of the Undergraduate programme obtained from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University. These students are to complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

e. 4th Year (Honours with Research): A 3-year Bachelor Degree with a minimum of 7.5 CGPA. The minimum entry requirement for 4th year (Honours/Research) UG programme within a period of three years from obtaining 3-year Bachelor Degree from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University. These students are to complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

Provision of Multiple Exit

Exit 1: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 1 year (two semesters). A Certificate will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 1 (2 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2nd semester examination.

Exit 2: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 2 years (four semesters. A Diploma will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 2 (4 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 80 credits will be awarded a UG Diploma (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4th Semester examination.

Exit 3: Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 3 years (six semesters). Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 120 credits.

ADMISSION RULES & REGULATIONS

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Application forms along with the prospectus for different programs of study can be downloaded from the college website. The admission process will be carried out entirely in online mode. For UG Courses, it needs to be processed on the Common Admission Portal of the Samarth e-Gov suite, and for HS Courses, it needs to be processed on the Common Admission Portal Darpan. After scrutinizing the applications, a provisional list of eligible candidates will be uploaded on the college website. From that list, students will be enrolled completely on a merit basis. The college authorities will have the final discretion with regard to admissions.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Admission will be strictly based on merit. Students who have passed HSLC or equivalent examination can apply for admission to the Higher Secondary Course under AHSEC. Students who have passed the 10+2 examination can apply for UG courses as per NEP 2020. Only regular students will be preferred for admission. However, those students who have passed the qualifying examination in an earlier year will have to submit a Gap Certificate in the form of an affidavit. In case the student has a gap period of more than two years; the admission committee will take the final decision.

RESERVATION CRITERIA

Reservation of seats as per norms of Assam Government will be extended to SC/ST (Plain/Hills)/OBC/MOBC/Differently Abled students subject to submission of relevant certificates from competent authority countersigned by the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district. In case any seat in the reserved category remains vacant, the same will be filled from the unreserved category.

FOR STATUTORY RESERVATION

Caste Certificates must be issued by the competent authorities and countersigned by the Deputy Commissioner of the District concerned.

FOR ECONOMICALLY WEAKER SECTIONS (EWS)

10% of the total seats are reserved for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWS). The eligibility norms for the EWS as per the Government of Assam Office Memorandum No. ABP.07/2019/3 dated 2nd February, 2019, are as below:

- 1. Persons who are not covered under the existing sections of reservations for the Scheduled caste, the scheduled Tribes and OBC/MOBC and whose family has Gross Annual Income below Rs. 6.00 lakh are to be identified as EWs for the benefit of reservation. Family for this purpose will include the person who seeks the benefit of reservation his/ her parents and sibling below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years. The income shall include income from all sources, i.e., Salary, agriculture business, profession etc. and it will be income for the Financial Year prior to the year of application. Also, persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWs, irrespective of the family income.
- a. Agriculture Land has more than 15 Bighas in rural areas.
- b. Residential land in rural areas has more than 1 Bigha.
 c. Residential plot in notified Municipal corporation/Municipal Board/ town
- c. Residential plot in notified Municipal corporation/Municipal Board/ town Committee Area more than 1.5 Katha.
- d. Residential Built-up area more than 1000 Sq. ft. in notified Municipal Corporation/ Municipal Board/ Town Committee.
- 2. The income and assets of the families as mentioned in Sl. No. 1 above will be required to be certified by an officer not below the rank of Circle Officer. The officer who issues the certificate would do the same after carefully verifying all relevant documents.

FOR DIFFERENTLY ABLED

3% of the total seats in all the Academic Programmes are reserved for the differently-abled students/persons with benchmark disabilities. Candidates applying for consideration under this category must submit a Medical Certificate issued by the Joint Director of Health Services of the district concerned and countersign on verification by the Senior Medical Officer, Dibrugarh University. Applicants being very negligibly differently-abled, such as visual deficiency and the like shall not be eligible for consideration under this reserved category.

Here, Section 2(r) of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 defines "person with benchmark disability" means a person with not less than 40% of a specified disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority;

In the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 the list of disabilities has been expanded from 7 to 21 conditions. These are as follows:

(i) Blindness; (ii) Low Vision; (iii) Leprosy Cured Persons; (iv) Hearing Impairment (deaf and hard of hearing); (v) Locomotor Disability; (vi) Dwarfism; (vii) Intellectual Disability; (viii) Mental illness; (ix) Autism Spectrum Disorder; (x) Cerebral Palsy; (xi) Muscular Dystrophy; (xii) Chronic Neurological Conditions; (xiii) Specific Learning Disabilities; (xiv) Multiple Sclerosis; (xv) Speech and Language Disability; (xvi) Thalassemia; (xvii) Hemophilia; (xviii) Sickle Cell Disease; (xix) Multiple Disabilities (including Deaf & Blindness); (xx) Acid Attack Survivors and (xxi) Parkinson's Disease.



EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

(a) Sports: 2% of the total seats

Eligibility: The student must have represented district/state in any of the sports recognized by IOA/SAI. Participation in the above-mentioned games and sports must not be earlier than three years before the academic session in which admission is sought. [The candidates may have to appear in a Qualifying Test in the concerned discipline.]

(b) Art & Culture/Literary: 1% of the total seats

Eligibility: Proficiency in Fine Arts or performing Arts, as evidenced by participation at the recognized Regional/State/National level competitions representing District/State. Proficiency in areas such as the field of Music (Vocal), Drama, Debating and Quiz, Fine Arts and Sculpture will be considered. In the case of music (instrumental) and Dance, Candidates will have to produce Degree/Diploma certificates from recognized institutions. [The candidates may have to appear in a Qualifying Test in the concerned discipline].

(c) NCC/NSS: 1% of the total seats

Eligibility: Students seeking admission under NCC quota must have represented the State (of Assam) in the Republic Day Parade in New Delhi sponsored by the Regional Directorate, N.C.C. or must have N.C.C. 'C' certificate. Candidates applying under NSS quota having the minimum qualifying criteria (NSS Completion Certificate and minimum Qualification marks) will be selected on the basis of possession of the certificates placed below in order of weightage:

i. National Level NSS Awardees

ii. State-Level NSS Awardees

iii. Member of the Indian Youth Delegation Team (International Youth Exchange)

iv. Republic Day Camp Participants

v. Participation in various National Level NSS Camps and Programmes

vi. Participation in various State Level NSS Camps and Programmes/ University Level NSS Programmes.

• Income Certificate from Circle Office.

• Adhaar Card, PRC, Bank Passbook, Permanent Education Number (PEN). 5. For selection of Honours course in any subject, the concerned department will issue separate

guidelines.

6. Those who have passed the last qualifying examination from outside Assam are to produce PRC/Trading License/Ration Card etc. issued from the DC or SDO (Civil). Those who are not permanent residents of Assam, but their parents are working in Assam/doing business, should produce a photocopy of a certificate issued from the place of employment/ration card etc.

7. A student who does not attend classes for seven days continuously from the date of commencement of regular classes, without any information, his/her admission will automatically stand cancelled. Such vacant seats will be filled on merit basis from the waiting list.

8. Students, other than 1st Semester, must take admission on the specified dates as notified by the College Authority, failing which a late fine will be imposed

9. College authority will not be responsible for any wrong statement of facts whatsoever given by the

students in their Admission Forms.

10. All admissions are provisional and subject to verification of the relevant documents and fulfilment of

necessary conditions of the College.

COLLEGE RULES & REGULATIONS

GENERAL RULES & CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. The students must maintain a high standard of discipline and shall endeavour to promote the honour of the college.
- 2. Every student shall have to submit the declaration along with the form submitting to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the college authority.
- 3. Entry of the students is prohibited into the college campus without proper uniform and identity card.
- 4.75% attendance is compulsory to be exempted from being dis-collegiate. Failure of the attendance will result in forfeiting the benefits of scholarship and other facilities.
- 5. It is a prime duty of the students to check the college notice board/website at least once a day.
- 6. Seat of the student will be forfeited if she/he is found absent for a period of 7 days from admission without intimation to the college authority.
- 7. All forms of ragging in the college campus are strictly prohibited. Violation of the dignity, status and honour of the students as well as verbal abuse, aggression and obscene behaviour etc. are liable to disciplinary action.
- 8. Students in college uniform, even outside the college campus, if found guilty of engaging in any kind of activities that affects the reputation of the college will be considered as a punishable offence.

HOSTEL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 3. It is compulsory to submit the undertaking at the time of hostel admission.

- 10. Staying of guests in the hostel is subject to prior permission of the Superintendent.
- 11. Non clearance of mess fees will be resulted as such withholding of result, scholarship etc.

12. The entry time of the hostel is 6.30 pm in summer and 5 pm in winter.

- 13. Boarders have to take the responsibilities of the room and the property allotted to them. In case of any damage to hostel property, the cost will be recovered from the boarder responsible for it.
- 14. Hostel authority will not be responsible for the loss of personal property of the boarders.
- 15. Boarders shall not indulge/carry any political and communal propaganda to the hostel.
 16. Cooking inside the room is prohibited. Belongings of the mess are not to be kept inside the rooms.
- 17. For the use of a water kettle, induction or self-cooking on occasion, the boarders are directed to use the power boards installed outside the room.

18. No boarder will bring personal pets to the hostel.

- 19. No boarder will be allowed to stay in the hostel during long holidays such as Puja vacation, Summer vacation, Winter break etc.
- 20. Boarders must take prior permission from authority for hostel trip, meeting, election or other kinds of function. Hostel authority will not be responsible for any mishap of the uninformed one.

21. Boarders would not indulge in any kind of dispute with the locals and illegal activities.

- 22. No boys will be allowed to enter inside the rooms of girls' hostel and vice versa. Groups may be considered on occasion.
- 23. The disciplinary action may result in such rustication, temporary suspension, fine, written or public apology, withholding of scholarship or result, handing over to police etc.
